

All Aboard! Model trains are seeing resurgence in popularity

Outdoors and overhead, it's the sweet sound of chirping birds, not the rumble and roar of airplanes, that fills the air. Floating vacations on the sea are, at least for now, on hold as cruise ships have dropped anchor. And on the highways, morning and afternoon commutes are suddenly a lot less congested.


But not everything has ground to a near-halt: In basements, dens, and attics, trains continue to traverse mountain tunnels and elevated bridges, passing by small towns and large cities and then making up time through pastoral farmland. Whizzing round and round, making figure eights and sometimes narrowly missing oncoming traffic, model trains are enjoying a resurgence in popularity, as they appeal to a new – and wider — audience. All aboard!

"There's comfort in a hobby that involves your hands," explained Stacey Walthers Naffah. The president of Wm. K. Walthers, Inc., Naffah is the first woman to head the company founded in 1932 by

her great-grandfather, one that still bears his name. As for Bill Walthers, his introduction to the small world of trains came on Christmas morning in 1899, when the six-year-old boy awoke to discover a windup choo-choo under the tree. Little could he know that the seed for what would one day be the world's largest producer and distributer of model railroad equipment was being planted.

An electrical engineer by training, Walthers made the inevitable switch to electrical model trains, "graduating" to "O" gauge. The attic of his home was at one point an "empire of standard gauge." Intrigued with the technical aspects of model trains, Walthers wrote magazine articles documenting his inventions and improvements before self-publishing the seminal book, *Signal and Control Manual for Model Railroaders*.

As his reputation grew, and as fellow hobbyists turned to him for guidance, Walthers (at the time "bankrupt and unemployed") transformed his passion for model trains into a catalog business. In 1932, he placed a small ad in a hobbyists' magazine, offering rail, couplers, and electrical supplies from his home in Milwaukee, Wis., at a time when hobby shops were few and far between.



model railroading. At the conclusion of World War II, fervor for the hobby swelled as returning servicemen, having seen more of the world than they could ever have imagined possible, set about creating their own universes. With limited space in smallish houses, these mid-century enthusiasts embraced the world of "HO" scale (1:48), taking advantage of leisure time and disposable income. To be sure, during the 1950s and early-1960s, model railroading was "ubiquitous in our pop culture," according to Naffah. For the most part, this was an interest fathers shared with their sons.

"This is a niche hobby and always has been," she continued. But even though the technical end of the hobby kept pace with the times, interest was not passed down to the next generation, and, as a result, the circle of modelers came to be dominated by older men.

It was this challenge that led Naffah to head her family's company two years ago, following her father's retirement. She pointed out that model railroading is a multi-faceted pursuit that can appeal to a variety of tastes and talents. Those intrigued with technology (like her great-grandfather) focus on making the trains

Lock of Washington's hair to highlight Bunch auction

CHADDS FORD, Pa. – Philadelphia, America's first capital and home to Independence Hall and the Liberty Bell, is steeped in political, military and social history. Its cobblestone streets, 18th-century buildings and revered educational institutions bear the names of prominent families whose origins date back to colonial days. One such Philadelphia family, the Hopkinsons, can count amongst its illustrious ancestors the patriot and Declaration of Independence signatory Francis Hopkinson (1737-1791). A lawyer, judge, author, composer, merchant and holder of many high public offices, Francis Hopkinson is also distinguished for having designed Continental paper money, the first United States coin, and early versions of the American Flag.

Now, 300 years after Francis Hopkinson's birth, his direct descendants have chosen to auction a treasured multigenerational family archive of Americana, documents, fine art and books that had long been stored away in 25 large steamer trunks. William Bunch Auctions of Chadds Ford, Pa., will conduct the live-online auction on June 23 simultaneously through four different bidding platforms. Live gallery bidding will not be permitted, due to the state government's COVID-19 lockdown.

The Hopkinson consignment is family owned and completely fresh to the market.

"The Hopkinson descendants who consigned the goods provided an extremely helpful inventory of the trunks' contents, but we were still pleasantly surprised at what we found," said Bunch. "We unwrapped very nice early 19th-century Philadelphia silver, sterling flatware, cut glass and Continental crystal, but the real treasure trove is the amazing collection of historical artifacts, manuscripts and unique Americana."

Perhaps no other item in the sale reflects the Hopkinson family's status more than the substantial lock of George Washington's (1732-1799) hair framed and encased in an ornate gilt metal locket. Two applied notes of provenance on verso indicate that the hair was "Cut by Mrs. Oliver Wolcot [sic.] at her house 4th & Spruce Sts. Phila 1798"

and that the memento was specifically for "Mrs. Jos. Hopkinson." The circumstances and individuals involved shine a light on the status of the Hopkinson family, since the Wolcotts were socially prominent Philadelphians and, at a dinner party at their home, Washington either offered or agreed to have a lock of his hair cut specifically for Mrs. Hopkinson, who may ington appointed Oliver

Wolcott Jr. to succeed Alexander Hamilton as Secretary of the Treasury," Bunch said. "We conducted extensive research that confirmed how socially intertwined the families were."

A royal lock of hair was found in the same box as the Washington memento. It belonged to Hopkinson family friend Joseph Bonaparte (1768-1844), the Count de Survilliers, former King of both Naples and Spain; and brother to Napoleon Bonaparte. Clipped on July 20, 1832, the day Bonaparte returned to Europe from the United States, the hair is framed and encased in a decorative gilt metal locket with an applied note of provenance on verso.

The collection also features important artworks, including a pair of 1857 Rembrandt Peale (American, 1778-1860) portraits. The subjects are Richard Colgate Dale Jr. (1810-1876), a surgeon, military officer and Master Mason; and his wife, Elizabeth Woodruff Dale. Each portrait is signed and dated, and measures 30³/₄ by 25 inches (sight).

Rare books and ephemera from centuries of Hopkinson family libraries will be offered. Many are author-signed or have inscriptions from those who presented them as gifts, including Joseph Bonaparte. Among the many highlights is Love Is Enough by William Morris. One of only 300 such books published by Kemscott Press in 1897, it is estimated at \$2,000-\$4,000.

RWCS Members and anyone who joins the club in the coming weeks can continue to order Commemoratives and Anti-Coronavirus League mini jugs until Saturday, July 11.

Cooper Hewitt shines spotlight on Suzie Zuzek

NEW YORK — All the colors. All those crazy designs. Resort wear all the "it" ladies of Key West and West Palm Beach had to have in the 60s and 70s. For ages, those who love Lilly Pulitzer's clothing line thought Lilly was the genius behind the prints. Now the Cooper Hewitt, Smithsonian Design Museum's spring 2020 exhibition celebrating the prolific textile designer Suzie Zuzek (Agnes Helen Zuzek dePoo, American, 1920–2011) tells another story.

It was Zuzek's imaginative designs and playful prints that played such a key role in the success of the Lilly Pulitzer clothing line in the 1960s and 1970s. Suzie Zuzek for Lilly Pulitzer: The Prints That Made the Fashion Brand opening July 24, will be the first museum exhibition to reveal the nature and scope of Zuzek's artistic contribution to the iconic Pulitzer style. The exhibition is organized by Susan Brown, associate curator, textiles, Cooper Hewitt.


More than 35 original watercolor and gouache design drawings by Zuzek, alongside finished screen-printed textiles and some of the fashions that made them famous will be on display. Key West Hand Print Fabrics of Key West was where Zuzek worked between 1962 and 1985 creating more than 1,500 designs for the company.

It was this company's designs that Pulitzer utilized to make her fashions. Kudos to Pulitzer for seeing how fantastic Zuzek's designs were and being cutting edge enough to use them. But she didn't stop there. Not only did Pulitzer develop a close partnership with Key West Hand Print Fabrics, she eventually bought controlling interest in the company.

Lovers of Lilly will tell you the Zuzek's prints are instantly recognizable; instantly associated with Lilly Pulitzer. The fact these fanciful prints were favored by the likes of Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis and Audrey Hepburn just added to their popularity and have-to-have status.

"For nearly a quarter of a century, Zuzek's limitless creativity powered the 'Lilly look," said Caroline Baumann, director of Cooper Hewitt. "Long overdue for public recognition, this exhibition will tell the important

story of a talented American designer who worked anonymously in support of a larger brand."

The archive of Key West Hand Print Fabrics, which are privately owned, includes watercolor designs and penand-ink drawings by Zuzek from her 23 years as a staff designer. Included in the exhibit are 10 drawings recently acquired for the museum's collection through a gift from the archive. Displayed together in this exhibit, Zuzek's designs showcase her extraordinarily creative treatment of various subjects, including mythical creatures and cosmology, to the flora and fauna of the Florida Keys.

The palette of colors Zuzek utilized were typically naturalistic, employing both the brilliant hues of the tropical flowers as well as the subtle shades of browns, ochres, and grays used in her renderings of animals. As any Lilly fan knows, the fabrics for the Pulitzer brand were printed in beyond-bright, vivid colors. The exhibition is unique in showing how the artist's original designs were translated to the process of silkscreen printing and then, fashion.

Rizzoli Electa will also publish a book corresponding to the exhibition; *Suzie Zuzekfor Lilly Pulitzer:The Artist Behind an Iconic American Fashion Brand, 1962–1985* with essays by Susan Brown and Caroline Rennolds Milbank.

PARMA, Ohio — Toys of Times Past has specialized in high quality antique and vintage toys at auction for more than 20 years. The firm held its Online Only Spring Vintage Toy Auction March 28. The auction house utilized LiveAuctioneers, Invaluable, and AuctionZip for live bidding and also offered pre-bidding and absentee bidding resulting in some wonderful vintage toys finding new homes.

On tap for this 2020 Spring edition was a great line-up of high quality tin windup character toys in original boxes from various manufacturers including Linemar, Marx, Chein, Unique Art, Linstrom, Chein and more. Another portion of the auction offered the largest multi-generation Greyhound Bus collection ever to be brought to auction.

Toys of Time Past explained in their pre-sale press material, the Greyhound Bus collection of Emery Brunelle that was brought to auction dated back to 1928 when he became one of the first Greyhound Bus drivers. The collecting was then carried on by his son, the late John S. Brunelle. "John owned and operated a California Greyhound Bus Terminal and was a very passionate collector of Greyhound Bus toys and transportation memorabilia and was involved in collecting most of his life," the material explained. "Prior to his passing, Mr. Brunelle donated some of his extensive collection to the Greyhound Museum and The American Heritage Center."

The auction started with vintage toys

and the variety offered was stellar. The top lot of this portion of the auction was a Linemar Superman Fighting Tank which realized \$1,850. Considered one of the hardest to find and most desirable of the all the Superman toys produced, this battery-operated Japanese made toy is just fantastic. When operating, Superman pushes the tank backwards then lifts it up. The tank then comes back down to the ground and the cycle repeats.

Also selling strong bringing \$1,800 was the 1920s made in the USA Marx Chicken Snatcher windup toy. Toys of Times Past explained this version with the African-American man wearing grey shoes is the hard to find version. This toy when wound up displayed various movements including walking action and the man's head also moved.

The B & R Charlie Chaplin tin windup toy was special in its own right, but it also sold with its original box. Toys of Times Past states that this was only the second example they have seen the past 25 years selling that came with the box. Chaplin stood 8 1/2 inches tall and walked when wound up. It sold for \$1,500.

Other windup toys worth noting included the Marx Disney Dumbo acrobatic elephant windup that also sold with its box. This Marx toy hailed form the 1930s and when wound Dumbo would flip over. It was in excellent condition; something not always the case with this toy due to its roll

over action. Dumbo with its box sold for \$750.

The 1955 Planter's Mr. Peanut windup walking toy offered at this March event was very hard to find because it was only available at Planters Peanuts stores. It was bid to \$650. And the Marx Uncle Wiggily tin windup car from the 1930s that sold this day not only retained its colorful lithography, it sold with its original box. With a rotating head and lots of charm, this toy realized \$400.

The extensive Greyhound collection offered this day was a bit soft as several of the Greyhound bus toys lots did not find new owners. Those that did include the Marx 1920s tine litho windup Coast to Coast Double Decker Bus sporting the Greyhound dog logo which made \$250, and a Marx Greyhound Lines bus terminal, also from the 1920s that sold for \$275. Wearing great lithography, the tin terminal included a pressed steel bus and a pressed steel car.

Greyhound Bus items with a cross-over collectible appeal found new owners. A 70 inch long, single-sided Greyhound Dog porcelain die cut sign used as a bus terminal coach sign sold for \$650.

And then there was the 1938 Hamilton Greyhound gold pocket watch that realized \$90. Inscribed on the back was, "Pennsylvania Greyhound Lines 10 Years Safe Driving E.S. Brunelle 1938", this Hamilton 14K, 21 jewel watch sold with its original Hamilton Bakelite watch case and box.

Toys of Times Past is currently seeking consignments for their upcoming Fall 2020 Vintage Toys Online Only Auction with that date to be announced in the near future.



run smoothly, especially interesting today thanks to a wide range of computerized accessories. Crafters can let loose their talents on producing landscapes and hardscapes, recreating favorite places and times, or drawing from their imagination. And for the collector, there are vintage buildings (think "Plasticville" as well as hand-fashioned structures from bygone years) and the challenge of old trains (there are those who still enjoy the smell of vintage steam engines, she confirmed).


Families, including Moms and daughters, are getting into the act, as many school programs are placing an emphasis on STE(A)M subjects (science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics). And although weekly train shows have been suspended for a while, this is one hobby that can still be enjoyed at home.

Before getting started, Naffah suggested that newcomers to the world of miniature trains decide the amount of space they can devote to their hobby. Those with little room might opt for "N" gauge (1:160), which is especially popular in Japan. Even smaller is "Z" gauge (1:220), which can be housed in a briefcase. For those with a large backyard, "G" gauge (1:25) might be the ticket. But "HO" remains the most popular, in large part because of the large selection of accessories on the market. "Diehards," she said, insist on scale perfection, but others find whimsy in a mix-and-match approach. Benchwork (the building of a platform) can be intimidating, but an elaborate construction is not necessary; a 4 by 8-foot piece of plywood on sawhorses, the bottom of a trundle bed, or even a drawer or suitcase can suffice.

There are many reasons why model railroading has been called the "World's Greatest Hobby," Naffah concluded. What was once a growing field during the Great Depression is once again a welcome pastime for those staying home. "We all want to tell a story," she said, "to remember places we love." And in the end, model railroaders have the opportunity to make a world "the way they wish the world was and to have control over it..
